Open the following website: <http://www.jersey.com/> and click on English (of course!).



On the left under **About Jersey** click on **The Island**, and from the dropdown menu choose **Countryside** and then click **View**.

- c What are the *Green Lanes*?
- d What is a *chiffchaff*?
- e Why is it easier to see Red Squirrels in Jersey than on the UK mainland?
- f What do the puffin, razorbill, fulmar and petrel have in common?
